RAISING MONEY FOR MISSIONS AT ROBERTSDALE UNITED METHODIST CHURCH IN ROBERTSDALE, ALABAMA

In 2015, Robertsdale United Methodist Women in Robertsdale, Alabama, raised approximately \$32,000 for missions. With the help of the United Methodist Men and the entire congregation, the women held their biannual Quilt Show in February and the annual Fruitcake sale in November.

In an on-going effort to “turn faith, hope, and love into action,” the efforts of this committed group of servants provided financial support for the following global, area, and local missions:

- World Gospel Missions - “Sharing the LIGHT, Restoring Vision” (Dr. Ben Roberts in Kenya, Africa)

- Under His Wings - Christian ministry for hurting girls providing healing and restoration to teenage girls in a home setting
- Women’s Medical Care Center - Christian ministry supporting women in all aspects of crisis pregnancy
- The Refuge for Women - a facility dedicated to caring for women suffering from addictions where women are taught to make use of Christian principles, Biblical truths, and faith to live a life free from substance abuse.
- Robertsdale United Methodist Church We Care Fund, Food Pantry, and School Uniform/Supplies Ministry
- Blue Lake Camperships providing funds for summer camping opportunities to children and youth
- General Mission Fund of the United Methodist Church

According to Nancy Robertson, Executive Director of the Refuge for Women, “Your generous gifts go directly to help support a woman fighting drug and alcohol addiction. The Refuge is very thankful for this meaningful connection to the women of Robertsdale United Methodist Church. Our women feel loved and cared for by your group. Thank you for your gifts, your prayers, and your concern.”

“We are once again overwhelmed and tremendously blessed by the donation from your fruitcake and quilt show mission project. Countless lives will be touched and many saved through your hearts of mercy and grace,” wrote Sue Leavins, director of The Women’s Medical Care Center.

An interest in the “fiber arts” and creative sewing has long been associated with the Baldwin County, Alabama, area. About 19 years ago a small group of UMW ladies, led by Peggy Wilcox and Mary Barnhill, decided to use this interest as a platform for mission fundraising. And so it began! The show has grown to what it is today showcasing over 300 quilts from quilters all over the country.

“Snowbirds” wintering on the Gulf Coast display quilts from the north alongside those of local quilters. Local merchants loan antiques and collectables to make the room displays truly unique and memorable. “This is not a juried show or a sale,” said 2017 co-chair Nancy Blackmon. “It’s an opportunity for all

quilters, beginners to advanced, to share their work and for others to enjoy this amazing fiber art. When the church is filled with these colorful quilts hanging in all the rooms, the halls, the fellowship hall, the chapel, and the sanctuary, it truly takes your breath away.”

“Visitors also have the opportunity to purchase soup/salad lunch and enjoy musical entertainment while they take a break from the show,” said Betty Gwaltney, 2017 co-chair.

Robertsdale United Methodist Women have also been raising money for missions by baking and selling fruitcakes for over 30 years. In the 1980’s, Mrs. Lolly Gravette shared her secret recipe with the ladies at Robertsdale United Methodist Church, and the rest is history!

Every year during the first two weeks of November the process begins. The fellowship hall and kitchen bustle with activity as church members gather to assist United Methodist Women in chopping fruit and nuts, carefully measuring and filling bags, and preparing the other ingredients. Since the heavy batter is mixed by hand, the men of the church take shifts with the bowl and spoon. For quality control, each cake is weighed to make sure it meets the two pound requirement before it’s sent to the oven for baking. Soon the entire church is filled with the unmistakable, yummy aroma of Christmas fruitcakes.

In 2015, 1400 cakes were baked and sold for a profit of over \$18,000.00 which goes entirely to the mission projects. According to Brenda Pierce, who took over the baking after Ms. Lolly passed away, “Baking fruitcakes is a labor of love. Church members are eager to do their part.”
