

Mission u 2017

Mission u 2017 was held at Millbrook UMC July 21-22. The Geographic Study: Missionary Conferences of the United Methodist Church in the United States was taught by Joyce Genz (Mobile District) and Kathie Harris. The Issue Study: Climate Justice was taught by Debbie Bracewell. The Spiritual Growth Study: Living as A Covenant Community was taught Clara Ester (Mobile District) and Carol Toney. These studies fulfil the purpose of the UMW by helping members increasing our commitment to global ministry.

On her 2017 Mission u experience, Gail Bradford notes, “Mission U is always a learning, advocacy promoting, and spiritually enriching experience. This year had something different because we each made our own nametags on pine rounds with beads, crosses, etc; and there was a separate time for crafts. The worship times and communion are set with litanies, sentences, and prayers that relate to the studies. My classes were with Clara Ester and Joyce Genz, our District was exceptionally well represented with great class leaders. The Mission U committee had everything well organization. I was amazed with Millbook's mastery--just the common of all the diets today--vegetarian, gluten-free, fruit-based, etc. while we try to stay healthy.

Spiritual Growth

My niece is 14 weeks pregnant with twins and triplets haven't been ruled out. She has already had three ultra-sounds and is scheduled for one every two weeks for the rest of the pregnancy. She already knows that she will be off work beginning with the eighth month, to be in bed the last two months. I bring this up because how different this is from many pregnant women around the world. United Methodist Women have always acted with faith in action for mothers and children. As we continue to study Maternal and Child Health, I want to ask you to journal and meditate about issues around births in your own family. What did you hear about your own birth? What do remember about births of your own children, grandchildren, nieces and nephews? These reflections will help you to prepare for the Spiritual Enrichment Day study sessions.

CWU shares many of the same interest that UMW have--health care for all people world-wide, environmental care, Creation and economic justice. The local CWU in Mobile provides several programs in our area: contact of children whose mothers are at Tutwiler Prison and visit to their mother, usually monthly; Alabama-ARISE--which works to improve the lives of low-income Alabamians; and tutoring and child evangelism in some Mobile County Public Schools.

- History of United Methodist Women
Leader: Clare Ester, National UMW Vice-President. She has a long list of successes as a Deaconess and has served a great part of her career in the AL W FL Conference, including as director the Dumas-Wesley Community Center.
- Praise Worship
Leader: *Amazing Grace Praise Team*, Toulminville-Warren Street United Methodist Church. The *Amazing Grace* Praise Team meditates on Scripture and offers praise and worship through dance.
- Maternal and Child Health
Leader: Cindy Messer, Recently Retired She is a RN midwife whose life-style is missions in action. She has served on the State of Alabama Board that certifies midwives. She and her husband, Phil, have been on mission trips to an orphanage in Honduras several times., the Red Bird Missionary Conference, and various UMCOR work teams. In June, she went to Haiti to teach midwifery, and infant health.
