NEW YORK, NY—United Women in Faith is pleased to announce the election of Sally Vonner to the position of General Secretary and Chief Executive Officer, effective June 1, 2023. The May 22 board vote culminated a six-month nationwide search.

Ms. Vonner joined the organization's national staff in 2010 as Assistant General Secretary of Membership and Leadership Development. With reorganization in 2018, she became the Transformation Officer, coordinating the organization's visioning and strategic development to positively impact the lives of women, children, and youth. She oversaw an organizational rebranding that opened new ways for women to join, introduced program innovations and initiatives, and rolled out United

Women in Faith as the new public-facing name.

"Sally is not just a woman who knows this organization but also a visionary who possesses a wealth of knowledge and experience," said 'Ainise 'Isama'u, board president. "She is the kind of leader who understands where we've been, where we are, and where we need to go."

Board Vice President Cynthia Rives said, "Sally's grasp of the current strategic plan will enable her to lead United Women in Faith boldly as we live out our belief that love in action can change the world. Equally important, she brings stability in a time of change as she is well grounded in our organization, knowledgeable of our history, and today's United Women in Faith.

Ms. Vonner is ready for the new challenge.

"My primary focus is to continue and expand the mission and reach of United Women in Faith as we put our love and faith in action to change the world, and work to improve the lives of women, children, and youth around the world," Ms. Vonner said. "I commit to lead with faith and trust in God, the support of the directors, the Program Advisory Group, my colleagues, and most of all, the members of United Women in Faith.

"I look forward to connecting with members, soon to be members, and The United Methodist Church family in the weeks, months, and years to come. Get ready for the awesome future God has for us."

The Texas native has served The United Methodist Church in several other capacities including women's retreat leader, and jurisdictional conference delegate and alternate in 2008, 2016, and 2020 representing the North Texas Annual Conference. Ms. Vonner was an organizer for the denomination's work on immigration assistance, community development initiatives, and dismantling racism work. She was commissioned as a U.S. missionary by the General Board of Global Ministries in 2000 to serve in the North Texas Annual Conference as the Communities of Shalom Coordinator. Ms. Vonner also served as the Associate Director of Connectional Ministries for the North Texas Annual Conference, 2005-2010.

Ms. Vonner serves on the boards of The Wesley campus ministry at her alma mater Texas A&M Commerce and is vice president of the New York Justice For Our Neighbors. She is a longtime member of Black Methodists for Church Renewal at the conference, jurisdiction, and national levels. She is also part of a women's leadership cohort with J.P. Morgan Chase's Community Development division, since 2021.

Ms. Vonner is a graduate of Perkins School of Theology with an M.Div. and Women's Studies Certification and Texas A&M Commerce with a B.S. in Biology.

A longtime member of First United Methodist Church of Grand Prairie, Texas, she regularly attends Teaneck United Methodist Church in New Jersey, where she is a member of the local United Women in Faith group. She is an active member of the Bergen County Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. [...]



Dangerous Prayers and Actions

Some years ago, I prayed that God would provide opportunities for me to serve others in ways that would take me out of my comfort zone. He answered that prayer in multiple ways far beyond my imagination. It wasn't long after my prayer that I was first asked to lead a Mission u study for the Alabama-West Florida Conference. I had attended Mission u and led studies at the unit and district levels but never at the conference level. After my leadership training, I was asked to be a substitute leader in another conference before I even had a chance to

facilitate my original assignment. I thought the logistics made it impossible, but in actuality, I was scared of making that leap. I got over my nerves after my first class and the next year, I did accept another conference's call to fill in on short notice. Teaching Mission u with a partner on Zoom was another new challenge that I accepted. I discovered that each time I successfully accepted God's opportunity to serve, a larger challenge was given to stretch my comfort zone.

This spring, I was really stretched in another direction. Part of my Social Action responsibilities is to be educated in the current United Women in Faith justice campaigns, Just Energy 4 All and Interrupt the School-to-Prison Pipeline. I attend nationally sponsored Zoom sessions on both campaigns as much as I can. This spring, conference social action coordinators were offered a scholarship to participate in the virtual Ecumenical Advocacy Days 2023 Conference on April 25-27. In addition to attending sessions, the scholarship required participating in a virtual meeting with a senator. I accepted the scholarship knowing that this would be another stretching challenge out of my comfort zone. I received great one-on-one mentoring from a national executive director for advocacy to prepare for a meeting with Senator Katie Britt's staff. If anyone would like to receive mentoring / training in advocacy, please contact me and I will offer some of my resources.

If we don't advocate for justice for the oppressed, we are supporting the oppressor. Fortunately for us, our United Women in Faith foremothers were on the front lines gaining justice for the oppressed and were thought to be troublemakers. Are you like I was, worried about gaining a reputation for causing trouble? Will you accept the challenge to step outside of your comfort zone? Only God knows what opportunities await you. May we become known as those pesky United Women in Faith, tirelessly seeking justice for all.

Vice-President – works closely with the president in understanding and interpreting all aspects of the program of United Methodist Women; performs the president's duties in the absence of the president; chairs the Committee on Programs guiding its members in planning programs, determining needed resources, involving a variety of women in the planning process.

Treasurer – See pp. 34-40 of handbook.

Communications – keep members informed of upcoming meetings; gather news from the district communications coordinator to be included in the conference newsletter, the *Alert*.

Membership, Nurture, and Outreach – works actively to fulfill the Purpose and find creative ways to nurture current members and cultivate new members.

Spiritual Growth – understand and communicate the connection between personal spiritual development and mission as expressed through social and global involvement; organize and promote special times and events for worship, prayer, and meditation such as, A Call to Prayer and Self-Denial, ecumenical worship, retreats, social action and advocacy events, and devotions at meetings.

Chairperson of Nominations (Selected from within the committee) – guides the committee in its work to find leadership for the conference. It is important that the committee know the skills, interests, and leadership potential of all AWF United Women in Faith to select those with the qualifications for the open officer positions.

Member of Committee on Nominations (Class of 2027)

Education and Interpretation (Still unfilled from last year) – promote and interpret the need for Mission Giving to fund the total mission program of United Women in Faith, including ministries with women, children, and youth, leadership development, spiritual growth, service and advocacy, and transformative education.


