Education and Interpretation

In the July/August 2022 *response* magazine, Ainise 'Isama'u, the national president of United Women in Faith, states," Working with the local unit is the key to this organization's success. If none of the information ever gets to the local unit, then what's the purpose of the national organization?' I say the same is true for the conference and district levels. As officers and coordinators, we must support our local units and make sure they get all the necessary communications and access to resource materials. "

Each individual member is important but the strength of the local unit is its sisterhood supporting each other and working together to reach women, children and youth around the world. The local unit is the origin of our mission dollars and our giving is the lifeblood to keep nearly 100 national institutions and projects open and serving communities in the United States. Our UWFaith mission is expanded by the numerous grants awarded each year to agencies that support our Social Action campaigns. On May 20, United Women in Faith announced at Assembly the awarding of a \$250,000 grant to strengthen the relationship of young girls and incarcerated mothers. The organization, Girls Embracing Mothers' (GEM), goal is to break the cycle of incarceration and support girls and women in their efforts to lead healthy, healed and whole lives.

Tamara Clark, our national treasurer, in her 2021 financial report defines where our dollars go. Total conference giving of \$8.7 million was supplemented by interest, rental and other sources for a total income of \$22.45 million with expenditures of \$27.54 million. Sale of property and the endowment more than covered the \$5.09 million deficit. The national organization continues to be excellent stewards of our monetary gifts and accomplished more with less during the pandemic.

We are challenged to increase our membership in order to support our pledges to mission for 2022. Telling stories is key to painting a whole picture of United Women in Faith's purpose. That knowledge impacts mission giving, recruitment of new members, involvement in social action and racial justice, and strengthening spiritual growth.

The **Reading Program** and other transformative educational opportunities are key components in challenging our worldview and sparking deep discussions. Recently, my local unit book club read *Failing Boldly: How Falling Down in Ministry Can Be the Start of Rising Up* by Christian Coon. This Leadership Development book from the 2021–2022 Reading Program list is highly recommended. We discovered that it applies to failures in any life situation so don't let the title dissuade you. The publisher's summary states, "Few people would consider failures to be a gift from God. If you are trying to energize and grow a ministry, however, embracing the lessons and gifts of failure may be the best way to maintain an encouraging place for people to seek the heart of God. Personal stories of missteps and mistakes of those working to grow ministries show how failure is a springboard to new experiences and, hopefully, a deeper connection to God."

Let us continue to tell the stories that educate and motivate us to greater service because we believe that love in action can change the world.



PROPOSED CHNAGES TO STANDING RULES

Changes to be voted on during the October 8, 2022 Business Meeting at Blue Lake Methodist Camp. You may review the entire document with recommended changes at www.awf-umw.org. The deletions are indicated by strikethrough font and the insertions are in red font.

Recommendation One: Revise the last sentence of IV. B.2 as below

- IV. Committees.
- B. There shall be a committee of District Presidents.
- 2. The committee shall select its chairperson annually. Her tenure shall be for one year only no more than two years.

Recommendation Two: Add a new section under V. Elections and Meetings. C. Tenure as below

V. ELECTIONS AND MEETINGS

C. TENURE

- 1. No elected officer will hold the same office for more than four years, except the treasurer, who can hold the same office for six years. Tenure on the leadership team for the elected leadership of the conference organization will be limited to a total of eight years.
- 2. When a leader serves as president and has tenure remaining to serve in another office (within the eight years), she is eligible to serve again. If a woman has already completed her eight-year tenure in positions other than president, she may still be elected president.
- 3. All years of service as an elected leader of any conference United Women in Faith, United Methodist Women, Woman's Society of Christian Service and Women's Society of World Service, including secretary/chairperson of the Wesleyan Service Guild, will be counted when determining tenure.
- 4. Service of six months or more in an officer year by an interim or acting officer will be counted as one year of tenure.
- 5. Appointed leaders not specified in the bylaws will serve no more than four years on the leadership team in any combination of such appointed responsibilities. This is in addition to tenure limitations described in Article V. C. 1 and C. 4
- 6. A two-year term as chairperson of the committee on nominations does not count towards tenure as described in Article V. C. 1 and C. 4. The two-year term does count as part of the maximum four-year term for leadership on the committee on nominations.
- 7. No elected/appointed leader of the conference organization will hold any other office beyond the local unit of United Women in Faith.

For those who were not able to attend our recent Mission u, a virtual Mission u 2022 will be offered on Zoom on 3 consecutive Monday evenings, September 12, 19, 26, from 7 to 9pm. The adult study, *Who Can We Be Together*, is "A Transformative Biblical Curriculum," which turns to the stories that Jesus told and Luke recorded in the 13th chapter of his Gospel, to challenge us "with a bigger and broader vision of the kind of community Christ is calling us to be in times of loss, grief, and massive disruption.


Goals:


