Go to **uwfaith.org/read** for the lists for 2024 and prior years, along with information about Faith Talks, eligible movies and purchasing books. The list is also included in the **November/December** issue of **response magazine**.

Mission Today Unit: Download a **Mission Today Unit reporting form**, which lists the criteria for local units. Many of the activities are done regularly by our units, so it is possible for any unit to complete a sufficient number to receive an award.

Mission Studies: You will be notified and informed of the names of the studies and the facilitators, as well as the date, time, place, etc.

Mission u: You will be notified of the date and place of **Mission u** for 2024. However, now is the time to begin discussing it and planning to attend.

Mission Giving: As our units plan for the year 2024, we must be mindful of the need for continual financial support of the programs and mission outreach of United Women in Faith across the United States and around the world. Pledge to Mission, Gift in Memory, Gift in Mission, World Thank Offering and Special Mission Recognition are some of the channels of mission giving that we use to support our mission.
