I know this has been a strange year, but our district is really showing that pandemic or not, we are ready, willing and able to continue being advocates for Women and Children; as well as the community. The units of the Mobile district sent over \$2600 to UMCOR. (This money helped provide items for necessary kits, since our ‘kit-making’ activity that is

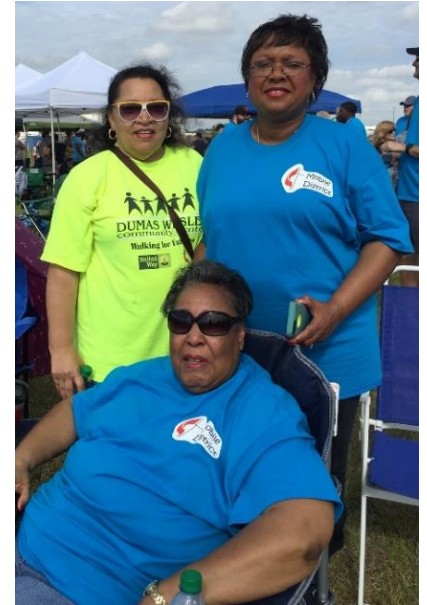

Marian Wright Edelman founder of Children's Defense Fund: Reminds us of how important this light, this refusal to conform, is to others. All of my mentors, men, women of different faiths all colors... Shared and instilled a vision and hope of what we could be, not what was.

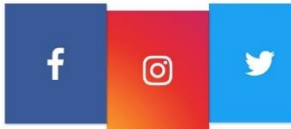
