

Thanks to all who attended the District Annual Day/Leadership Development Day at First UMC in January. Thank you to Panama City First UMW for the fine hospitality.









First, postage rates have steadily increased over the years, along with the costs of printing hard copies. As technology keeps developing, we are finding that we can save approximately \$400 per year by publishing our newsletter online; therefore, we are currently having each new issue posted on the official Alabama-West Florida UMW website:
