

Education and Interpretation


We have just completed the Cooperative School of Christian Mission for 2010. I hope many of you attended this year. It was a great school. The studies this year are exceptional and as always very timely with the topics. Our spiritual growth study was For the Love of God: John's Letters; general issue study: Joy to the World; Mission & Evangelism and geographic study: The Courage and Beauty of Sudan. Remember attending the school helps to fulfill Mission Today criteria #2.

This is the time of year when we begin to compile reports in preparation for district and conference annual meetings. If your unit made kits for UMCOR — check off #18. Look over the criteria and I am sure you will find that most of you have completed many of the items on the list. Remember ... these kits are being shipped to Haiti and Chile to help them recover from the earthquakes. YOU MAKE MISSION POSSIBLE! Read your April issue of Response magazine containing articles on mission and evangelism which is the general issue study for this year's school. There is a wealth of information in all of the articles. Go to your next meeting with a review of one of the articles and give a "Response Moment". The unit then fulfills Mission Today criteria #13.

You probably have already fulfilled many of the steps to be a Mission Today unit this year! If not, you still have time to be a MISSION TODAY UNIT! The most important step is to make and meet your pledge. If a unit has made their goal you have also completed #10 of the Mission Today program. Do you use the <u>Prayer Calendar</u> (#6) and correspond with at least 5 persons listed during the year? Have you implemented the Charter for Racial Justice and become a Charter Club member? (#8) I know that many of you have already checked off many of the Mission Today criteria and are on your way to becoming a Mission Today unit. **LET'S DO IT!!!**

Another way to become a Mission Today unit is to have attended Conference Annual Meeting (#3) at beautiful Blue Lake Camp Grounds last October. If you did not attend last year, come and celebrate the accomplishments of your district and unit this year on October 23 and you will be able to check it off your list for next year's Mission Today Report. II. DUTIES OF APPOINTED LEADERS, Art II, p 101

- New to Standing Rules) The Blue Lake Representative shall represent the conference mission team on the Blue Lake Board of Trustees.
 - The Blue Lake Representative promotes plans for raising funds for Blue Lake, i.e. "In Honor", "In Memory"
 gifts to be forwarded to the conference treasurer, supervise the storing and handling of all properties
 belonging to the conference United Methodist Women (in the UMWcloset).

III. COMMITTEES, Art. III and IV, p.101-105

- D. There shall be a Committee on Registration
 - 1. The committee shall be composed of the following:
 - a. Registrar, appointed by the president, shall be the Chairperson
 - b. Treasurer
 - c. Communications Coordinator
 - d. Blue Lake Chairperson
 - e. others as determined by the Executive Committee
- E. There shall be a Committee on Communications

The committee shall be composed of:

- a. Communications Coordinator, who shall be the Chair
- b. Vice President
- c. Secretary
- d. Mission Coordinator for Spiritual Growth
- e. Mission Coordinator for Education and Interpretation
- f. One District President

- D. Each member of the local unit shall may give \$2.00 per year to supplement the Administration and Membership Development expenses.

- 4. Seventy-five cents (.75) of this amount shall be given to Noah's Ark in Panama City, Florida:
- 5. Seventy-five cents (.75) of this amount shall be given to SKIP, Inc. in Montgomery, Alabama;
- Seventy-five cents (.75) of this amount shall be given to Hispanic Ministries within the Alabama-West Florida Conference of the United Methodist Church.

Spiritual Growth

As your Spiritual Growth Coordinator, I attended the South Atlantic Regional School Of Mission at Ferrum College in Virginia sponsored by the Women's Division. In addition to training, I took the spiritual growth study For the Love of God: The Epistles of John. My leader began by quoting the Serenity Prayer. She asked us to think of one thing in our life that could not be changed. There were diverse answers, but the consensus was that each of us is a beloved child of God, chosen by Him for His purpose. Each district will have an opportunity to "show their colors" and share their mission activities and accomplishments.
