

Interested? Want to organize a young teen circle in your unit? There are lots of ways to engage teens in mission. Below are a few suggestions:

- <> Write cards to missionaries to ask them about their projects!
- <> Participate in ongoing service projects like health kits understanding where they go/who it reaches.
- <> Participate in or start a youth program at School of Christian Mission.
- <> Create fun and different ways to raise money for mission (bake sale/walk-a-thon/reading a book of the Bible per month, etc.

There are three important resources anyone interested in forming teen circles needs:

- Criteria and Guidelines for Adult Women Sponsors: a complete guide to identifying, selecting
 and equipping adult women to serve as sponsors of district units, circles and subgroups. Each district
 unit, circle of subgroup is required to have an adult woman sponsor.
- Let's Get Together Organizing Kit: A step-by-step guide to organize a district unit, circle of subgroup teens and college/university women. Each step describes what you need to do, who is involved, and where to turn for support and resources.
- 3. What's the Purpose?: Six sessions, with reproducible handouts, activities, worship and ideas for expanded sessions and a retreat format, this booklet reviews the Purpose of United Methodist Women.

Finally there are Women's Division Start-up Grants available. Teen circles must have designated adult sponsors and demonstrate clear goals and plans for promoting the Purpose of United Methodist Women through spiritual growth, mission education and action, etc. Please contact me and I will help in obtaining an application if your are interested in one of these start-up grants.





Spiritual Enrichment Speaker

Cathy Byrd is the Program Manager for Women and Families Ministry at the Panama City Rescue Mission in Panama City, FL. In addition to providing case management for families in emergency shelter, she oversees the operation of the 21 bed long term residential addiction recovery program known as Bethel Village. Bethel Village is a very structured addiction recovery program based on



instruction in Christian discipleship. The program includes completion of a Christian 12 step program, as well as other Christian studies, 36 hours a week of work therapy, and demonstration of one's ability to live successfully in a group environment and embrace Christian character and behavior development.

Cathy began her work at Panama City Rescue Mission as a volunteer, presenting devotionals to mission guests. While completing her master's degree, she worked part time for the Homeless and Hunger Coalition, administering a Department of Labor grant doing vocational counseling with homeless clients of the mission. She began full time work as the Women and Families manager in November 2008. She continues her part time role as Director of Adult Christian Education at Lynn Haven UMC in the Panama City area, which she has held since 2003. She helped start the Celebrate Recovery group in Panama City and facilitated a support group for women with depression for six years.

Cathy's husband of 38 years, Bill, is retired and looks after their three cats and pug dog, Tiger. They have two married children and are the grandparents of five.

Cathy received her Bachelor of Science degree from Auburn University and has a Master's Degree in counseling from Troy University. She is currently enrolled at Asbury Theological Seminary as part of her candidacy for ordination as a deacon in the Alabama-West Florida Conference of The United Methodist Church and is committed to spiritual formation and discipleship training of adults, especially those who find themselves in crisis or life transition stages.



Cheryl Mothershed will the Spiritual Enrichment Music Director. She is a member of the First United Methodist Church of Bay Minette. There she serves as the Director of Children's Ministry. Cheryl is also the Baypines District President. She also directs two hand bell choirs. Cheryl has served at many Churches throughout

Baldwin county as Music Director. Cheryl lives in Bay Minette with her Mother and dog Agnes.



Elizabeth Bell will be playing the piano for the Spiritual Enrichment Retreat. She is a member of Marianna First United Methodist Church and a retired elementary teacher who enjoys singing and playing the piano.
