This year's effort will mark the end of United Methodist Women's anti-human trafficking initiative, as the organization shifts its efforts and resources to its previously announced mission priorities of climate justice. January Legacy call to justice will include racial justice and women's rights.

- Stand together all dressed in Red
- Wear red choir robes, red hats and shoes, or gather a room full of redheads
- Hold something red—flowers, cups, stop signs,
- Dance in a red room
- Sit on red furniture
- Stand on a red carpet
- Raise red banners, wave red fans or flags
- Record a video of your unit as participants in the *Red Sand Art* project: an activist artwork created to raise awareness of modern-day slavery. Participants are invited to fill sidewalk cracks with red sand. Learn more here: Predsandproject.org/about


