SOCIAL ACTION

During our Officer Update/Training session at Blue Lake Assembly, Cami Hacker, Joyce Genz and I gave a report on the National Seminar held August 13-18, 2011 in Birmingham, AL. This event is held every four years to engage the participants in education and action opportunities for social justice. The theme for the event was Mission: Reconciliation — Restoring Justice, Building Community. Opportunities were provided to share and learn more on issues concerning immigration, human trafficking, domestic violence and climate change.

As a result of our participation in such an informative and powerful seminar we returned energized, equipped and prepared to make a difference in the lives of those traumatized. due to the results of immigration, human trafficking, domestic violence and climate change. We challenge you to join us on this journey to create a new moral order in America.

We challenge every local unit to read "The Journey-Forgiveness, Restorative Justice and Reconciliation," as well as participate in the mission study on "The Journey." Secondly, we challenge every local unit to become involved in some action plan addressing one of the four priority issues of the Women's Division (immigration, human trafficking, domestic violence, or climate change). Thirdly, we challenge each of the eight districts to select at least one of those issues as a district priority. Finally, we challenge the conference to choose one of the issues for a Bold Faith Seminar to be held sometime in 2013.

Our District Mission Coordinators for Social Action chose the following priority issues for 2012 in the AL -West Florida Conference:

2012 SPIRITUAL ENRICHMENT RETREAT AT BLUE LAKE ASSEMBLY

"Friendship and Faith" Retreat Leader: Rev./Dr. Laura Early March 23-25, 2012



A Spiritual Retreat is a way of "re-treating" life. It allows us " to treat our life again with the love of God", so we can re-retreat daily life with the hands-on service of love and justice. This event is one of the highlights of the year for United Methodist Women.

The theme is "Friendship and Faith". The scripture reference is Proverbs 3;5-6--"Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not unto your own understanding. In all your ways acknowledge Him and He shall direct your path".

We are fortunate to have The Rev. Dr. Laura Early from Aulander, North Carolina as our retreat leader. Dr. Early has served the United Methodist Church for over 30 years. Her career began in Christian Education where she served at Duke Memorial and McMannen United Methodist Churches in Durham, N. C. She also served in Christian Education at Queen Street United Church in Kinston. Dr. Early has served as Pastor of the Aulander and Gatesville United Methodist Charges. While she was serving at Gatesville it was recipient of the Kay Taylor Award for Outreach and Evangelism in the North Carolina Annual Conference.

Laura was appointed to a North Carolina Annual Conference Pilot Project as Elizabeth City District Director of Christian Education where she worked with the district in strengthening local churches through programing and leadership training. She later accepted an appointment as Pastor of All God's Children in 1997. All God's Children focuses on meeting the needs of children and has established programs to meet the needs of "at risk" children through Morning Lambs, a preschool program; After School FAMILY, a program fostering learning; and HOME BASE, a food and clothing distribution facility.

Laura is a native of Durham, NC. She and her husband, Bill, have three children and two grandchildren.

Our Music Leader is Pam Dannelly of Pensacola, FL. She graduated from Huntingdon College in Montgomery, Al. with a degree in Music. After 31 years of teaching she retired and is now active in volunteer work in the Great Gulf Coast Festival, the choir program. She is the unit president of Pensacola First United Methodist Women. Pam and her husband, Bill, are the proud parents of two sons and grandparents of four adorable grandchildren.

Our pianist is Nancy Carleton. She has been the organist at Monroeville First United Methodist Church since 1991. ISSUE STUDY: POVERTY – Poverty is a human rights issue with grave impact on women and children. Written by Dr. Jack A. Keller, with chapter contributions by other selected writers, this mission study on poverty is designed to help participants recognize and claim for themselves the connections between Scripture, church tradition, compassion for the poor, social outreach, and social justice. Stories of those living in poverty and multiple and diverse examples of encounters between middle -class Christians and the poor are woven throughout the study. Participants in the study will engage in deepening their understanding of the realities of poverty and be invited to commit to solidarity with the poor through accompaniment and advocacy. This study will be offered as an 8-hour study and also as a 5-hour mini study during the school.

GEOGRAPHIC STUDY: HAITI – It is nearly impossible to convey the full scope of Haiti's culture and history in one study, and so Rev. Dr. Jacques E. Pierre freely admits that this mission study "does not assume it captures every aspect of Haiti and its people's daily realities, their rich and vivacious culture, nor their long history of struggles." What it does offer is an overview of the cultures that shaped Haiti's past and the ongoing legacy of colonialism, along with glimpses into the heart and soul of Haiti's people through pictures and Creole adages. The mission study also includes the impact of the devastating January 12th earthquake in 2010.

SPIRITUAL GROWTH STUDY: IMMIGRATION AND THE BIBLE – This study shares the story of the Bible as a narrative of immigrants and migration. Exploring the Biblical and theological understanding of immigration, immigrants and migration, this study seeks to enable the participants to examine what it is to be a sojourner and to live into the biblical mandate of hospitality for "the stranger" and "aliens" in our midst. This study seeks to equip participants to see the Bible as the ultimate handbook for responding to immigrants. The Bible was written by, for, and about migrants, immigrants, refugees and asylum seekers. It gives directions for responding to sisters and brothers from around the world who come to a land seeking safety, sanctuary and sustenance. The Bible offers guidance and direction for persons who migrate or immigrate by choice as well as for persons who flee because of devastation and destruction through violence or natural disasters.

Responsively Yours: "Something there is that doesn't love a wall"

For me, these words of Robert Frost call to mind the cold stone walls separating fields and properties through the forests and hills of New England. While they serve their dual purpose of providing a place to put stones removed while clearing the fields and of demarcating boundaries, over time these walls break down, spreading out in the bracken so that they seem to disappear. In some places the stones are collected and reused, and in others, they remain a silent testimony to the lines that seemed important enough to merit the labor it took to build them.

Let us not give walls undue power. In this new year, let us dream of peace, but let us also

commit ourselves anew to work for peace, and to declare the message of the love of God for all peoples on earth.

This process of building walls and demarcating boundaries also reminds me of walls that have fallen in places around the world where the work of

reform and reconciliation has taken place. I have a little piece of the Berlin Wall in my kitchen — a souvenir from a trip that my dad and my brother took. Imagine! A fearsome, military installation deemed important to world order and national security—removed in tiny pieces that could be glued to plastic forms by enterprising vendors.

At the same time, we are continuing to defend other walls and fences. The "peace walls" in Belfast remain in place with Protestant and Catholic communities divided on either side, only coming into contact at the "interfaces" or through intentionally planned activities. The walls have allowed generations of children to grow up not knowing one another, separated by school uniform, calendar, tradition and fear.

In communities along the southern border of the United States, families with members on both sides of the U.S.-Mexico border are funneled through checkpoints replacing the previously free interchange. Fear and law and violence make these walls and fences even more restrictive.

A similar pattern is at play in Israel and in Korea where people are separated from one another in the name of security. Governments and those with a financial stake in maintaining division use all the usual weapons — fear, policy, intimidation and financial incentives — to build

physical boundaries and to reward and coerce separation and suspicion. All this takes place despite the fact that the people affected often have more common interests with one another than they do with those in positions of power and would be better served by working on their common interests than by focusing on what divides them.

Something there is that doesn't love a wall. Parties may need time apart for reflection, to regroup, or to allow the heat of passion to cool, but separation is not a long-term solution. Separation does not make peace. United Methodist Women members know we must work together for the good of all.

Let us not give walls undue power. Borders change. Alliances change. Only God's love remains steadfast. In this new year, let us dream of peace but let us also commit ourselves anew to work for peace, and declare God's love for all peoples on earth.

There are scholarships available through the Conference and through some of the Districts so check with your District President or any of the Conference Mission Team about availability and criteria of those scholarships.

I hope you will also make plans to attend this year's Cooperative School of Christian Mission being held at Huntingdon College August 2nd through 5th. The study leaders and musicians are going to be great. There will be studies for youth and children available as well.

How many times do we allow the pressures of family, work and life in general to control our lives to the point that we forget who we are - to whom we belong? Does our life, our attitude, our behavior reflect God living in us? I pray that God will remind me daily that my life is a witness to others - it is my choice whether it is a good witness or a bad witness. Our Purpose is to be about God's work and to be a reflection of God's love for others to see. What greater privilege is there than to share God's love and grace with another?
