Extracted from Alabama-West Florida United Methodist Women Standing Rules.

IV. Elections and Meetings.

The voting Body of the Annual Meeting of the conference organization shall be composed of the following:

One representative from each Local Unit,

Conference Executive Committee,

Bishop,

District Executive Committees,

District Superintendents,

Directors of UMW residing within the conference,

Officers of the Jurisdiction residing within the conference.

The Election and Voting process is as follows:

The Executive Mission Team will be nominated, elected and installed as United Methodist Women officers. They will need your support to lead and organize our AWF-UMW membership for the Purpose of mission for women, children, and youth.

We will receive the Committee on Nominations (CON) Slate of Officers report for the next term from the CON Chair. As President, I will explain and conduct the election process before the membership present. We will proceed with the election and end with the installation of those voted into positions. Only those AWF-UMW delegates attending notated in our Standing Rules will Vote. There are no absentee votes; your participation is very important and we will need your attention to this election process.

#### STANDING RULES

Upon review of the Alabama West Florida Conference of United Methodist Women Standing Rules, the committee determined that clarification was needed for the term of this position. Please note the recommended addition is printed in BOLD.

The Committee on Standing Rules is recommending the following changes:

- I. Appointed Leaders, Art. II, pg. 101
- 5. Representative to the Conference Board of Laity
- 6. The Web Master
- II. Duties of Appointed Leaders, Art. II, pg. 101
- 4. The representatives appointed by the president to other boards and agencies shall represent United Methodist Women. They will attend all their meetings and give a written report to the president the actions of that board or agency.
- 5. The Board of Laity representative shall represent United Methodist Women and will attend the meetings. She shall give a written report to the president the actions of the Board of Laity.
- 6. The duty of the Web Master is to maintain the official Alabama-West Florida conference United Methodist Women's website at <a href="https://www.awf-umw.org">https://www.awf-umw.org</a>.
- II. Duties of Appointed Leaders, Art. II, pg. 101
- g. One district president
- i. business session during the Spiritual Enrichment Retreat.

#### VI. NOMINEES TO NATIONAL METHODIST WOMEN

e. National will select a representative from the list in the event a director is not elected from this conference at the Southeastern Jurisdiction Quadrennial Meeting. The person selected by National will represent the conference on the Program Advisory Group for one term (4 years).

#### VII. FUNDS

- a. **No more than 40%** of the conference/**districts** mission giving shall be used for the administration and membership development expenses of the conference, and **1%** of the annual pledge shall be sent to the Southeastern Jurisdiction fund for administration and membership development and a remittance to the districts for administration and membership development. A remittance to the districts for administration and membership development, \$300.00 from each district's administration and membership development funds shall be designated for representation by districts beyond the conference to Assembly and/or Jurisdiction.
- b. The only monies a district may hold at years' end are as follows:
- d. In the first quarter of the year, district treasurers shall subtract the \$750 start-up monies from their request for funds from the A&MD **budget**.

thy: "I remind you to stir into flame the gift of God which is within you." - 2 Timothy 1:6

Our emblems reminds us of our <u>PURPOSE</u> of growing in our understanding of and willingness to participate in the global ministries of the church. The overall fluid and free flowing shape of the emblem suggests change and mobility.
