## LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT



As I think over the years I have served on the district team, I think about the changes, challenges, and Christ's blessings in our district. Our numbers of units and members has declined—something other districts are also experiencing. We are still “a community of women whose purpose is to know God . . . and to expand concepts of mission through participation in the global ministries of the church.” While 2020 has been a challenging year, I know you are continuing to work in your communities to help women, children, and youth. Until we fill the vacancies, we will need every unit president to attend the district mission team meetings. We want you to have a voice in what is planned and how those plans are carried out.

While our church doors may be closed, the Church is not; neither is United Methodist Women as you have already shown. Our work will never be complete while women, children, and youth are in need. I have been serving on the district board since 2011. Many of you have served your district and unit for longer than that. Each conversation explores themes and resources that empower us to put faith, hope and love into action. A living wage refers to a theoretical income level that allows an individual or family to afford adequate shelter, food, and the other basic necessities. The goal of a living wage is to allow employees to earn enough income for a satisfactory standard of living and to prevent them from falling into poverty. According to the Department of Labor, the federal minimum wage is \$7.25 an hour. As we know, this will not provide an adequate income to meet the needs of housing, food, clothing, medical care, etc. Join us September 23 to hear Jacqueline Allen from Alabama Works.

Let us be grateful if we are still bringing in an income either through work or a retirement pension. But some of us are negatively impacted by this year's pandemic.

From the United Methodist Women website:

What happens if you or a loved one falls ill, and you get no pay when you're out of work? You get zero wages, may deplete savings and incur debt, and could lose your job. Join our campaign to urge members of Congress to support the bipartisan FAMILY Act guaranteeing paid family and medical leave for all!



## DOTHAN DISTRICT MISSION STUDY

### *Finding Peace in an Anxious World*

Spiritual Growth Mission Study: 2020

*Finding Peace in an Anxious World*, the 2020 Spiritual Growth Study by staff of the Urban Village Church, uses the book of Proverbs and “The Serenity Prayer” as a guide to help Christians find their way through anxiety, worry, and fear and move towards God’s peace that surpasses all understanding. Using “The Serenity Prayer” as a scaffold, *Finding Peace in an Anxious World* explores ways to discover peace through scriptural and spiritual disciplines so that we can be rooted in God and energized to live fully as disciples of Christ.



“The Serenity Prayer” shaped a 2015 four-part sermon series at the Urban Village Church in Chicago. It was through that series that the church was able to address the tumultuous events of that summer and present a framework for how to approach a God who desires peace for the hearts of God’s people in times of anxiety. These sermons are the basis for this book.

The four chapters, each written by a different Urban Village Church leader, focus on different aspects of the prayer—serenity, acceptance, courage, and wisdom—and each concludes with a spiritual practice to help further develop the featured characteristic in your life.

**The Dothan District is planning a 4-part live Zoom mission study.** We have scheduled these sessions for October 7, 14, 21, 28 to begin at 10:00 A.M. and end at 11:00 A.M. Each session will last approximately 60 minutes depending on participation. The studies will be recorded so you will be able to access the study if you miss a session. The book may be purchased online through [unitedmethodistwomen.org](http://unitedmethodistwomen.org) or through Amazon.

### Alabama-West Florida United Methodist Women Online (ZOOM) 2020 Voting Information

Due to the cancellation of our in-person 2020 AWF-UMW Fall event / Spiritual Enrichment Retreat, we will now hold electronic elections for the 2021-2022 nominees in a ZOOM meeting on October 10, 2020. Here is a summary of the voting process:

- Each nominee's bio and office are included in this edition of the Alert for your review.
- The ZOOM meeting guide and instructions will be shared with voting delegates from the District Presidents and Conference President at a date determined closer to the Election date.
- Our election process includes Nominations from the Floor. This part of the election will be recognized on September 10, 2020 (a Thursday) from 12 Noon until 8:00 PM (same day). The nomination from the floor name, Bio and picture should be sent email to the Conference President during this same time.
- Nominations from the Floor will not be accepted in the Election Process during the 9:00 AM Election Time on October 10, 2020.
- Election requirements are As stated in our Standing Rules; the voting delegates include the following:

#### III. ELECTIONS AND MEETINGS Art. V. pages 105-107

1. The electorate of the conference organization shall be composed of the following:
  - a. One representative from each local unit.
  - b. Conference Executive Committee
  - c. Bishop
  - d. District Executive Committees
  - e. District Superintendents
  - f. Directors of the National United Methodist Women residing within the conference
  - g. Officers of the Southeast Jurisdiction Organization residing within the Conference

The voting process includes a ZOOM meeting, and a guide will be shared at a date closer to the election, but some basics include these steps to "join the meeting":

1. Click on the meeting information provided 1-week prior to the Oct. 10th election. This invitation will include the web info and phone numbers if connecting with your phone.
2. Join a meeting using one of these methods: Click Join a Meeting if you want to join without signing in.
3. Enter the meeting ID number and your display name.
4. Select if you would like to connect audio and/or video and click Join.
5. You will be placed into the meeting and asked to mute or at meeting start ALL will be muted.

This election on ZOOM will be different for all of us. Please be open and receptive to the new way of electing our next term of officers. The committee on nominations has worked throughout all the conference to find our new leaders for the 2021-2022 term.
