2020 Dothan District Pledge to Mission Received \$10,787.68

There is no doubt that 2020 has been a difficult year for everyone. I have heard many people say that they are just ready for it to be over, but we must remember that we have many things to be thankful for each day. I am thankful for each one of you and am looking forward to the day that we can meet in person.

United Methodist Women's mission did not stop because of the pandemic. Your continued financial support for United Methodist Women provides funds to help women, children, and youth in the United States and around the world. I have received \$10,787.68 toward our district goal of \$14,000. This is 77% of our 2020 goal! Also, I have collected \$1,701.15 for our Call to Prayer and Self-Denial offering, \$376.00 for the Mattie Kolb Scholarship, and \$1,920.00 for our Conference Love Offering.

I am not sure what all of our meetings will look like next year, but be assured that Jane and I will do our best to make our meetings occur and to keep you informed about what is going on in the district and the conference. We will need your help. We need our members to attend our ZOOM meetings until we are able to meet in person. When we start to meet in person, we will need units to step up and offer to host meetings.

I believe that our January Training Meeting and our District Annual Day in February will be ZOOM meetings. I hope you will participate in these and all other meetings. Also, I hope that by April we may be able to have an in-person mission study. If you did not attend the ZOOM mission study in October, please visit our District United Methodist Women's website. There are links to the study on the webpage (it was one study broken into four parts).
