There may be other avenues that afford us some of the same opportunities that we are privileged to in UMW, but the UMW organization and its mission have a unique way to bring us together, do good work, and be the supportive community God intended us to be.

The position of District E&I Coordinator oversees the annual district-wide mission studies and the progress of our wonderful directive tool, Mission Today, a great guide to what we need to be doing locally in UMW. This year we were blessed to have the study on "Living in a Covenant Community" which reminded us of who our neighbor is and how we are to live in a wholesome communal environment and the study on Missionary Conferences of the United States where Tutti Johnson opened our eyes to more in-depth activities and needs of three US conferences to which we are lending support. ### **MEMBERSHIP**

## Social Action: Love Your Neighbor As Yourself

United Methodist Women have studied many issues this year in our mission program. All of the subjects planted a little seed of Faith, Hope and Love. Let us begin with the Faith Seed.

We must believe that big things can, and do, grow from small seeds. Greet your neighbor with just a Smile, a warm voiced Hello, or a Wave of the hand in recognition of their presence. Imagine what one seed of Faith can do. Remember that " Faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen." (Hebrew 11:11)

When we ask God for something, don't be surprised when he gives you that and more. We must have Hope even when we do not see God working.... He Is Working! We need to do good deeds and let it become a daily habit and automatic part of your life. Are you happy and love that warm feeling you get after you have helped your friend, neighbor or stranger?

Eight (8) times in the Bible we are told to LOVE our neighbor. This is one of the Bible's most repeated commands. Whether they appreciate you, or respond to your love, Jesus' command is still valid: You must show love to your neighbor in a practical way. If we really love our neighbor, the first thing to do is pray for them. Through our request in prayer, God is given requests to work in our neighbor's lives.

Who is my neighbor?......A neighbor is someone, who is near-by, wherever you are. Us loving our neighbors is a part of God's plan to bring them to him and our love demonstrates what God and His kingdom are like.

My sisters in Christ, our love should not be just words and talk; it must be true love, which it shows itself in *action*.

## Do you need a Mission Project?

## Maternal and Child Health

The 2017 Prayer and Self Denial program about the lack of feminine hygiene products for girls and women following childbirth in underdeveloped countries opened the eyes of 4 churches in the Montgomery-Prattville District (Clanton, Mulder, Metropolitan and Millbrook).

Girls cannot attend school during these 5 days a month because they do not have access to hygiene products or cannot afford them. It is believed that girls who stay in school are less likely to marry early or die in childbirth and they are more likely to train or educate their families. Following childbirth many women develop infections because they do not have clean hygiene products.

One solution to this problem is to provide girls with their own Hygiene Kit which contains 3 pair of underpants, a soap dish and bar of soap, a wash cloth and 6 washable pads with safety pins for closure, and a zip lock plastic bag for soiled pads. All these items are enclosed in a pretty draw-string bag. The pads are very absorbent, washable and expected to last 2-3 years.

The first shipment of 60 Hygiene Kits for girls and post partem mothers was sent in December 2017. We now have 52 more to ship this month. Our kits went to Haiti where Rev. Steve MacInnes and his wife Tish were missionaries. Pastor Steve is a member of the AWF Conference and currently is serving a church in the Montgomery-Prattville District but still maintains contact with Haiti.




