Destin UMW—In the early 2000's Jan Hinch, a beloved member of Destin UMW (now deceased), presented an idea to the membership that was the preparation and distribution of chemo kits to be presented to patients undergoing chemotherapy. This would be a gift of care and comfort to be used as they spend time receiving their injections. Members gather twice each year to assemble kits.

Each kit contains comfort items such as: chapstick, hand cream, hand sanitizer, water and mints, along with a pillow, book, notebooks, pens and tissues. Included for encouragement are Bibles (white for women, black for men), various poems and blessing prayers. As a special gift an angel pin is tucked inside for women and a bookmark/tie tack for men, all created in the Destin's UMW jewelry workshop. Upon assembly and blessings from the minister the chemo kits are then distributed to Emerald Coast Cancer Center and Ascension Sacred Heart Cancer Center.



First Church Pensacola UMW—During the pandemic while the church facilities have been closed the Prayer Shawl ladies have continued to be busy. This busy group has been Zooming weekly at noon every Tuesday. Three of their projects include:

- Prayer Shawls for 2020 graduating seniors.
- **Prayer Squares** have been given to employees of local Adult Congregate Living Facilities, Jennifer Piver has distributed 445 squares to encourage these heroes who are caring for so many elders.
- **Fiddle Mats** for dementia patients who need something to keep their hands busy are being created. This is a new ministry for the group. They are gathering large (1 inch and above) buttons and other items that can be sewn onto the crocheted mat that sits on the lap of a person.
